





Your Guide to Applying for Working Connections Child Care (WCCC)

When It's Required for Best Starts for Kids Subsidy

Why Apply For WCCC?

The Best Starts for Kids Subsidy Program requires some families to apply for the Working Connections Child Care (WCCC) subsidy first. This is because WCCC is a state-funded subsidy and may cover more of your child care costs.

If your income is below a certain amount, you may be required to apply for WCCC and provide a denial letter before we can process your Best Starts Subsidy application.

If your gross income (before taxes) is at or below 60% SMI, you must submit a WCCC denial letter or a waiver.

If your income is between 60–65%, we recommend applying to avoid delays.

Don't Wait!

You must send us the WCCC denial letter within 14 days after we ask for it.

If we don't get it and don't hear from you, your application will be marked incomplete.




Give DCYF your child care provider's name and phone number.


Submit income and work/school details.

To move forward with Best Starts Subsidy, your WCCC denial letter:









How to Send Your Denial Letter
